It sports many remarkable characteristics, including a butterfly roofline, wonderful expanses of glass that admit sunlight, and beautiful cypress paneling, brick floors and an open staircase! The easement is a template for future easements on classic Greensboro properties by preserving the general form of the building, contributing architectural details, and key interior materials that make this house so special. Thanks to Kay, and her generosity, we can rest easier knowing that this Greensboro landmark will not fall to bulldozers for redevelopment.

At the top of our headlines this year is the fact that we mark the **20th anniversary of Architectural Salvage of Greensboro**, a volunteer based initiative to rescue old house parts. It is recycling at its best.

In the past two decades, ASG is recognized as one of the oldest surviving not for profit salvage operations, as well as a highly innovative way to raise funds in an environment where organizations are struggling. ASG

has involved hundreds of volunteers through the years that have served on SWAT Teams (that's Saving Worn-out Architectural Treasures), helped tidy the showroom, explored new marketing plans, and stubbed toes, taken splinters, and pulled their backs for preservation.



Also central to our mission to save Greensboro's architectural and historical treasures is the **Tour of Historic Homes**. We initiated our first tour two

the John and Barbara McLendon Family Foundation, and the Weaver Foundation; 2012 was the year that Blandwood's original A. J. Davis-designed windows were repaired and returned to working order. We are one of the few sites in the country that have original Davis windows, and today they are well-cared for...at least for another 20 years, or so! We so appreciate our partners in preservation.

We are hoping that contributors will step forward to help us restore the historic windows on the south façade of Blandwood in 2013. These are very old windows, some of which date back to the construction of Blandwood in 1795. We are also focusing fundraising efforts on repairing the plaster and repainting the stucco north facade of the house. Both of these efforts have high price tags, the window repair will cost upwards of \$30,000, but we will do our best to gather resources to get that work done.
