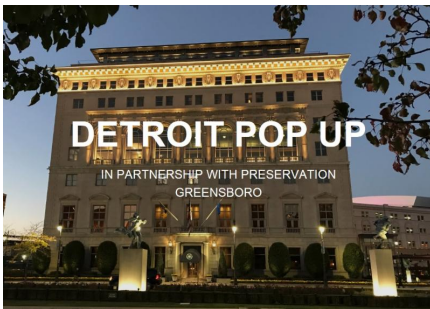

Historic Tax Credit Update

In 2015, our community rallied to support legislation to reinstate our Historic Tax Credits. These credits sunset in 2020, but House Bill 399 (H399) proposes to extend and slightly amend existing tax credits. The Bill, sponsored by Guilford County Representatives Cecil Brockman, Ashton Wheeler Clemmons, Jon Hardister, and Pricey Harrison, also includes an additional 5% bonus for rehabilitation in places that have been declared disaster areas. Credits are tax tools taken after an investment of funds, in this case, restoration of a building to high preservation standards.

Notable changes from previous legislation include the disaster area bonus, and a new sunset date that extends the law forward ten years, and an increase in investment caps to facilitate large scale reinvestment. With broad and bipartisan support in the House, we are hopeful that our state senators Garrett, Gunn, Robinson, and Tillman will extend their support to historic preservation. With opportunities available for preservation reinvestment in all corners of Guilford County, this legislation is a logical and pragmatic tool for our future.
