Deduction for Charitable Donations UPDATE

For those individual taxpayers that itemize deductions, the charitable contribution deduction is no longer limited and 100% can be deductible. Non-itemizers are now allowed a \$300 "For AGI" deduction for charitable contributions for 2020.



African American Architectural Heritage Project

Work continues on an architectural survey of African American neighborhoods in Greensboro, with a focus on the Nocho Park, Clinton Hills and Benbow Park areas, and surrounding streets. The survey will evaluate expansion options of the same National Register benefits and honors available to other historic neighborhoods such as South Greensboro and Sunset Hills by documenting story lines and architectural styles of these communities. The work should be completed this summer.

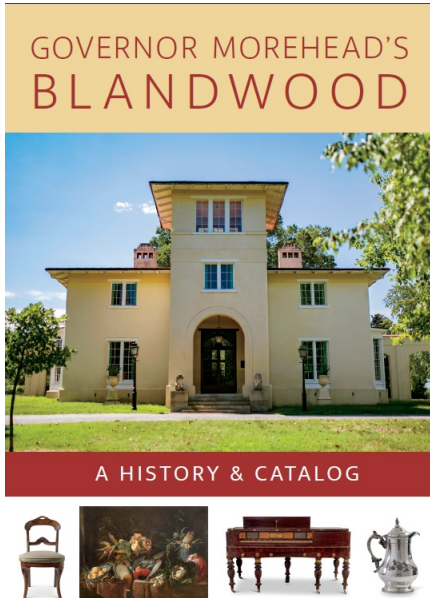
